Public Sector Research Establishments Potentially Eligible for Strategic Priorities Fund grants

Eligibility for Public Sector Research Establishments (PSREs) was incorporated into the design of the Strategic Priorities Fund (SPF) to enable it to achieve one of its objectives; to ensure that UKRI's investment links up effectively with Government departments' research priorities and opportunities. There is no agreed definition or a definitive list of PSREs, and so UKRI have developed the following initial list of PSREs potentially eligible to bid for Research Council grants under the SPF.

To be eligible for SPF funding delivered by Research Councils, PSREs will need to demonstrate research capacity and capability relevant to Research Councils, as per the standard eligibility rules and application procedure found here: <u>https://www.ukri.org/funding/how-to-apply/eligibility/</u>.
