## ERA-HDHL Call for Joint Transnational Research Proposals on

# "Addressing adverse and beneficial effects of food ingredients and food processing on hypersensitivities to food" (FOOD\_HYPERSENS)"

The UK component of applications should be costed in GBP on the basis of full economic costs (fEC). If the grant is awarded, funding will be provided in GBP and on the basis of 80% of fEC as per standard BBSRC/MRC terms and conditions. The submitting organisation(s) must agree to fund the balance of fEC for the project from other resources. The 20% contribution from submitting organisation(s) should be recorded as an "in cash contribution" in the blue column indicated below.

The funders expect that **individual consortium applications will not request more than €285,000** (as the total cost, at 80% fEC) for the UK component per proposal.

UK costs should be entered on the transnational application in Euros at an exchange rate of  $\pounds 1 = \pounds 1.14$ . The requested funding must be equivalent to the 80% that will be requested from Research Council funding.

Applicants should include a statement in the application form (below the UK funding table is probably the best location) to confirm the exchange rate used, and that the requested costs are entered at the 80% fEC level on the application form. This statement should also confirm the amount requested in GBP.

#### Failure to adhere to this guidance might mean that your application is rejected.

#### Please note:

Your proposal must fit the specified remit of this call; there is no need, however, to match your work package (as a whole or in part) or its costs to a specific funder (i.e. either BBSRC, MRC or FSA).

PhD students, or items of equipment over £10k, cannot be funded by BBSRC, MRC or FSA as part of this call.
