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This national STEM programme, created by ASDC and delivered by the UK's Science Centres, had communities and inclusion at its heart. Working with foodbanks, young carers and other community groups, Operation Earth Phase 2 aimed to inspire curiosity, questioning and an overall interest in environmental science research and its processes.

Said the Training Academy was 'Very Successful' or 'Successful' in increasing their knowledge of the Operation Earth programme as well as increasing their confidence to engage with local science centres.

87.5% of the children who took part said they learnt something new about our climate or environmental science.

62.5% said they now felt more interested in reading or finding out about climate science and the environment.

87.5 % of participants, following their participation in Operation Earth, thought it was very important that Scientists research our planet and climate.
