### Notice of funding

1. Research England is allocating £30 million of Enhancing Research Culture funding to higher education providers (HEPs) for 2022-23, as notified in our July 2022 circular letter 'Funding budgets for 2022-23 to 2024-25'<sup>1</sup>. This funding is provided to enable HEPs to develop and initiate activities in response to the R&D People and Culture Strategy.
2. The government's 2021 R&D People and Culture Strategy<sup>2</sup> sets out a vision for ensuring the research system is made up of talented and diverse people with the right skills, working in an environment that nurtures and gets the best out of everyone.
3. Enhancing Research Culture funding can be used by HEPs in any of the areas covered by the R&D People and Culture Strategy to pilot new initiatives, increase the scale of already-proven activities and continue activities already supported via this funding stream. HEPs will be able to work alone, in collaboration with other HEPs or organisations outside of the HE sector in line with their own strategic objectives and priorities.

4. Areas for potential investment by HEPs include, but are not limited to:
  - Improving access to and participation in research, including postgraduate research study, for people from currently underrepresented groups;
  - Furthering open research practices;
  - Improving research conduct and reproducibility;
  - Tackling bullying and harassment;
  - Improving research leadership skills across all career stages;
  - Creating routes for collaboration and exchange with businesses, third sector organisations and government;
  - Securing and supporting the careers of researchers and associated professions;
  - Diversifying recruitment, reward and recognition approaches at all career stages;
  - Delivering new approaches to public dialogue and community-led research.
5. As the cost of activity to improve research culture in HEPs will vary according to the number of researchers they employ, the funding will be allocated based on a measure of total volume of research staff and postgraduate research students.
6. Eligible total volume is defined as the sum of:
  - a. FTE number of staff with an academic contract that is both teaching and research, and who have significant responsibility for research as reported in the 2020-21 HESA staff return;
  - b. FTE number of staff with an academic contract that is research only as reported in the 2020-21 HESA staff return;
  - c. FTE Postgraduate research student numbers as reported in the 2020-21 HESA student return.
7. The total volume measure is rounded up to the nearest 50 FTE and the results of the allocation model are rounded up to the nearest £50,000. There is a minimum allocation of £50,000 and a maximum allocation of £1 million.
8. We recognise that for those less familiar with this level of Research England investment, spending this allocation may be a challenge. We encourage you to discuss challenges with your Institutional Engagement Manager<sup>3</sup>.
9. Allocations to HEPs are shown in [Annex A](#). Payment of the full grant amount will be made to each HEP in October 2022.
