RESPONDENTS felt HEARD

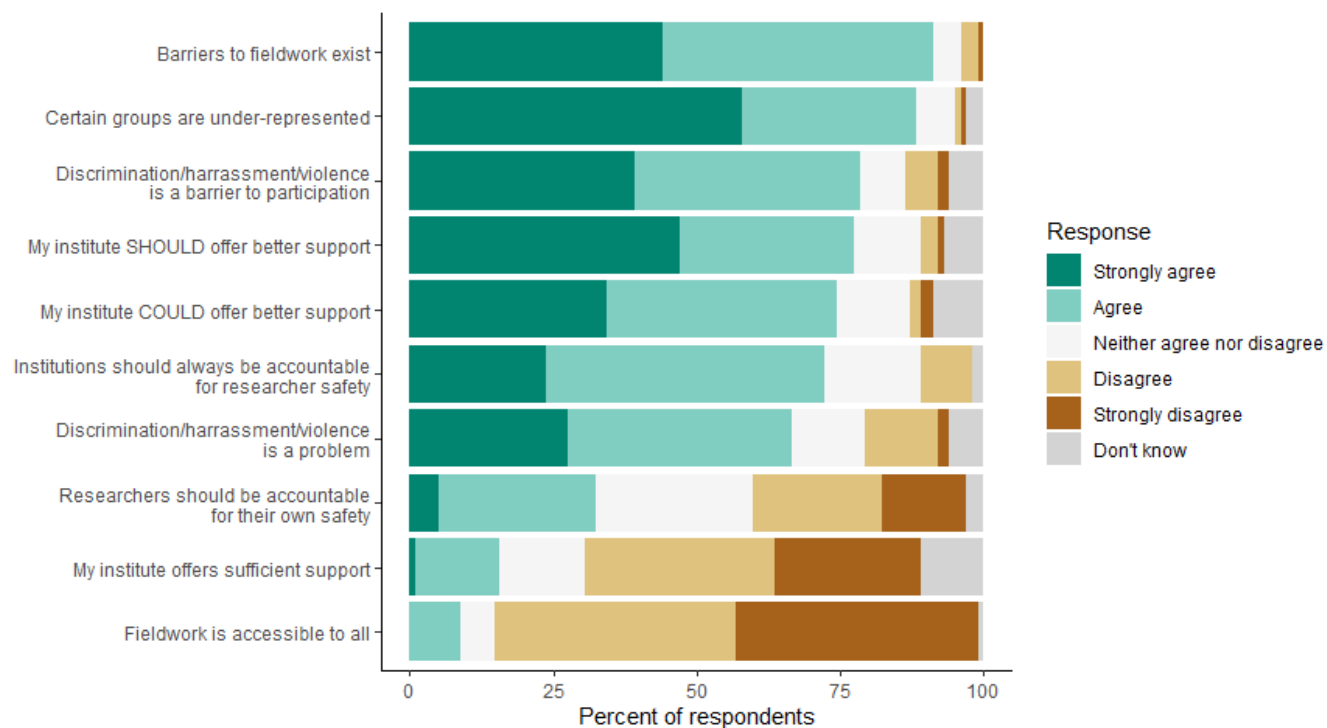
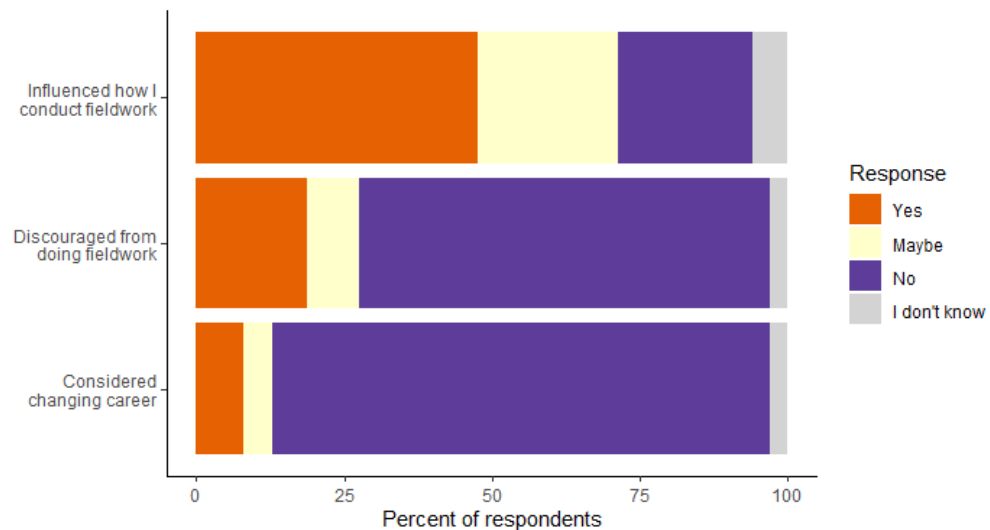
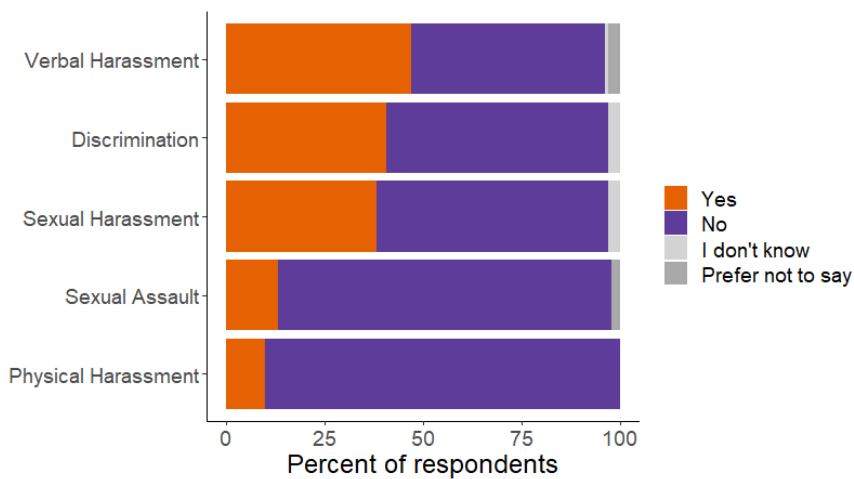
FOCUS WIDENED to LGBTQ+ ETHNICITY "BEYOND LONE WORKING"
