How do people perceive, value, and benefit from heritage?

1. How people's values can affect heritage decision-making & how the sector can work collaboratively with the public and communities in heritage decision-making and participation in exploration, conservation and presentation of heritage
2. How communities and identities shape and give meaning to heritage assets and settings, and how "heritage encounters" impact people's perceptions, behaviours, and understandings
3. Methodologies for sharing a plurality of perspectives within heritage contexts, with a focus on ensuring the inclusion of historically marginalised communities
4. Enabling access- what is it that people want from heritage places and how can we better meet the needs of communities which may encounter barriers to access
